# County councillor's monthly report for September 2019

A little more action with first committee meetings after the summer break.

#### **Full Council meeting**

There was no meeting. The next one is in October.

### **Committee meetings and other council matters**

<u>Adults</u>: there were two key decisions. One related to a consultation about proposed changes to what people pay for council services. See the consultation link below. The other was to agree an update to the agreement whereby Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Foundation Trust delivers mental health services on behalf of the Council under a Section 75 agreement. There were also a couple of secret items on the agenda.

<u>Children & Young People</u>: there was one key decision whereby the Council will support a feasibility study for the redevelopment of Ramsey Abbey School.

<u>General Purposes</u>: the committee met; the agenda was short with no key decisions.

<u>Highways & Infrastructure:</u> the committee approved its winter service (that's gritting to you and me) plan. Fortunately the B1049, Park Lane, High Street and Impington Lane, and Cottenham Road/Station Road/Cambridge Road are all priority gritting routes. There's a map online. <u>Commercial & Investment</u>: the committee met twice. The first time was a regular meeting when there was one key decision relating to the appointment of an energy project delivery contractor. There was also the inevitable secret session for it to review This Land's performance and the Heads of Terms for the disposal of Shire Hall. The second meeting was a pre-meet before the This Land AGM to agree voting positions. The AGM itself was secret but I'll venture to say that one resolution was not supported.

<u>Planning</u>, <u>Communities & Partnerships:</u> these committees did not meet.

<u>Economy & Environment:</u> another non-meeting with the committee meeting to comment on consultations.

<u>Health</u>: there was one key decision viz to agree to continue to support the falls prevention program from reserves. In its scrutiny role the committee looked at the Clinical Commissioning Groups' financial plan (it is in dire straits).

The <u>Greater Cambridge Partnership Executive</u> did not meet. The <u>Assembly</u> met and, inter alia, supported the Histon Road bus, cycling and walking improvements final design.

The Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority and most of its committees met.

The <u>Health & Well Being Board</u> core joint sub-committee met to approve the Better Care Fund plan for 2020. The whole system joint sub-committee met immediately afterwards and reviewed several reports.

The <u>Cambridgeshire Police & Crime Panel</u> and the <u>Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Fire Authority</u> did not meet.

The Station Sidings site finally has its planning permission and I've been told that demolition of the old Bishop's building is 'imminent'. On the High Street we've sadly seen the closure of Lighthouse Toys but there is now good news as its new tenants will be Print Out which will vacate its units on the school Hill site.
