## **Full Council meeting**

Go to <a href="https://wp.me/p7tuu7-1Tz">https://wp.me/p7tuu7-1Tz</a> for my account of this month's meeting. It was a short meeting; we were out in time for lunch. I proposed a motion to ensure that the Council's budget be developed in line with its Climate Emergency commitments. This was passed unanimously. Later I asked that the Combined Authority also recognise the Climate Emergency. See below for more on this.

#### **Committee meetings and other council matters**

<u>Adults</u>: there were two key decisions. One related to a Mental Health and Autism Accommodation Framework for Adults for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. This is good in principle but you worry about there being enough money to do what's needed. The other was about the procurement of family carer's services which had been delayed because of the financial issues at the Clinical Commissioning Group.

<u>Children & Young People</u>: there was one key decision whereby the Council 'noted' the intention to go out to tender for the South Fenland Child and Family Centre Services, as part of joint tender exercise with Peterborough City Council.

<u>General Purposes</u>: the committee met; the agenda was again short with no key decisions of note.

<u>Highways & Infrastructure:</u> There were no key decisions. It noted two proposals to improve revenues in the budget viz bus lane enforcement and civil parking enforcement at Park & Ride sites.

<u>Commercial & Investment</u>: the committee met. There was one key (non) decision whereby it approved complying with new rules requiring upfront but refundable payments to be made in connection with energy projects which require a grid connection. It also went into secret session, as it invariably does, to review the Spokes (sic) part of the Cambs 2020 project.

<u>Planning</u>. This committee met but there were no planning applications on the agenda relevant to Histon and Impington. An officer decision to allow the temporary classroom at Histon & Impington Junior School to be used until 31 Aug 20 was noted.

<u>Communities & Partnerships:</u> there were no key decisions. There was a progress update on the CIVIC libraries project of which Histon Library had hoped to be a part. There seems to have been little.

<u>Economy & Environment:</u> There were no key decisions. It noted the same two budget proposals considered by Highways & Infrastructure Committee. It also considered the internal audit report on the Ely Southern Bypass fiasco.

<u>Health</u>: there was one key decision viz to enable by delegation the re-commissioning of the integrated Lifestyle Service as one service working across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

The <u>Greater Cambridge Partnership Executive</u> met and, inter alia, signed off the Histon Road bus, cycle and pedestrian improvements project. The <u>Assembly</u> did not meet.

The <u>Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority</u>, its <u>Overview & Scrutiny (O&S) Committee</u> and <u>the Housing & Communities (H&C) Committee</u> met. At the O&S meeting the Mayor suggested that the Authority would not be declaring a Climate Emergency because he 'hasn't seen the evidence

for it'. At the H&C meeting approval of a grant of £215,000 from the £100m Affordable Housing Programme was given to enable delivery of five new affordable homes at Whaddon Road, Meldreth.

The <u>Cambridgeshire Police & Crime Panel</u> met and agreed to note a number of reports. The <u>Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Fire Authority</u> did not meet.
