Three Free Trees Initiative

Every parish in South Cambs is being offered three free trees by the District Council as part of ambitions to double nature.

South Cambridgeshire District Council is contacting all 103 parish councils in the area to invite them to apply for a voucher which can be exchanged for three trees, or one large one, at a local garden centre. The voucher will also pay for stakes and tree protection guards. We hope that every village takes up this offer as it will mean hundreds of new trees are planted across South Cambridgeshire. The idea is to show that when you join lots of small positive changes together, they contribute to something much larger.

With trees absorbing CO₂ from the atmosphere, they play a key role in helping to combat climate change. The District Council has already declared a climate emergency and, in November 2018, pledged to work towards making the District zero carbon by 2050.

Final Decisions on Zero Carbon Communities Grant

On the 20th December, the Grants Advisory Committee together with the Climate Change and Environment Advisory Committee met to review all of the eligible applications to our new Zero Carbon Communities Grant. A very comprehensive evaluation report had been prepared by our officers on all of these applications. There was a fantastic response across the District from community groups and Parish Councils, including exciting applications from community groups in Histon and Impington, and in Orchard Park. The final decisions will be made public very soon this month.

One-Stop

The Orchard Park One-Stop store is closing for a refit on Sunday 19th January and will reopen under the Tesco Express brand approximately two weeks later. If the work goes according to plan this means the new store will open Monday 3rd February. If you have any concerns about vulnerable residents being unable to access other shops during this period please contact us.

Scheme of Delegation for Planning Committee

It has come to our attention that Parish Councils in the district have recently received a letter from the Director of Fews Lane Consortium Ltd, alleging that the Council is proposing to make a major

change to the way the scheme of delegation operates. Please do not be alarmed. At February Planning Committee meeting, a proposal to slightly amend the wording will be made by the Chair of Planning Committee in order to avoid any risk of legal challenge. This is a technical change in wording to avoid any ambiguity. The process remains the same in that Parish councils and Local Members will continue to make requests for an application to be decided by committee and these requests will be considered at a meeting by the Chair of the Planning committee together with Planning Officers delegated by the Joint Director of Planning.

Local Validation Checklist Consultation

Since 2008 local planning authorities have been required to publish a list of information they require to "validate" the planning applications they receive.

In addition to the statutory national information requirements, the Local Validation List sets out the additional documents that the Local Planning Authority will require applicants to provide (depending on the type and scale of application) in order to make their planning application valid.

It will be a joint plan shared by Cambridge City and South Cambs, which will be a powerful tool to ensure there is joined-up thinking in the developments which affect us all in both areas.
