#### **Call for Sites**

The District Council have now released their much awaited 'short-list' of parcels of land in South Cambridgeshire that they believe have planning merit and will be taken forward to the next stage of the process. This short-list was derived from a much longer list of sites put forward by potential developers and landowners earlier this year. The proposals put the Environment right at the centre, driving the sites selected and they propose to add a further 11,596 to the current 37,198 in the pipeline in both adopted local plans.

The outcome is that <u>NONE</u> of the parcels of land in our area are being taken forward by South Cambs (apart from the Impington Lane site that is already nearly completed but falls within the plan period). The policy is to concentrate the major development into existing and forthcoming settlements, such as Cambourne, Northstowe, Waterbeach, Bourn Airfield etc. with a few minor releases of the Green Belt to the East of the City, in a strategy designed to minimise travel emissions. The overall level of development is to be limited due to water supply constraints – the aquifers will not be able to cope with additional depletion and new resources must be found which is not logistically feasible until the local plan following the one currently being drafted has commenced.

A thank you to all those that had an input into the process so far but there will be further public consultation on these short-listed sites, should anyone wish to make further comment.

#### Covid-19 Update

The case rate is 307.2 per 100,000 in Cambridgeshire (2 September), a very gentle decrease in our region even though the national rates are still increasing. decrease on the same time last week. This

compares with national rate of 332/100,000 cases, but higher than the regional average (283 cases per 100,000). South Cambridgeshire has a rate of 279 per 100,000, and Histon, Impington and Orchard Park 298 per 100k., about the regional average.

Public Health England and CCG have set up more pop-up vaccination clinics and encouraging young people 16-17 who only became eligible in August to get their vaccination. Secondary school students are being encouraged to test twice a week to help identify those who have Covid without symptoms and young people aged 16 - 17 should get vaccinated before the start of term. While children returning to school will no longer be in bubbles and school life will look more like it did pre-Covid, families are still being asked to be cautious and to stay alert for the signs of Covid and get a PCR test if they have symptoms.

Please take extra precautions, wear a face mask in public places, limit contact with others and consider those who are more vulnerable. **Hands-Face-Space** is still the wise thing to do.

The District Council has launched a new fund that businesses looking to grow and expand can now apply for. It's aptly called the 'Growth Fund' and between £1,000 and £50,000 can be applied for at one time. South Cambs Council has agreed to support three Afghan families by providing homes for them in the district. The families will relocate to the UK through the Afghan Locally Employed Support (LES) scheme.

#### **Local development proposals**

The proposed mobile phone/5G mast and associated cabinets on New Road was turned down by planning officers because of its impact, but has been resubmitted. It is reduced in height (now 15m), but still of a significant scale. Comments should be made rapidly since this is a prior notification development and the local authority has a limited timescale to react. The new application reference is 21/03731/PRI16A and comments should be submitted by **24**<sup>th</sup> **September** (extended from previous date of 8<sup>th</sup> September)

The proposal for a house on Impington Lane is to be considered by committee due to its drainage implications. Following previous problems in gardens adjoining the new Impington Lane development, which proved difficult to resolve within the statutory powers and procedures (although the developer is apparently making proposals to rectify the problems), this has become a current issue and procedures need to be reviewed in the new local plan.

#### **Civil Parking Enforcement**

We welcome recent progress on plans to improve the way illegal parking is tackled.

Introducing civil parking enforcement in South Cambridgeshire, which was discussed at Cambridgeshire County Council on 7<sup>th</sup> September, would see responsibilities for tackling illegal parking shift from Cambridgeshire Police to the County Council. This would mean drivers parking illegally and inconsiderately, such as on double yellow lines or too close to a junction or a school, could be fined by Civil Enforcement Officers. This arrangement is common in most other parts of the country and will be considered for South Cambridgeshire by the District Council's Cabinet as the County Council's plans progress.

The County Council will now prepare an application to the Secretary of State for a Special Enforcement Area, via the Department for Transport, to introduce civil parking enforcement in South Cambridgeshire, as well as the districts of Huntingdonshire and Fenland.

In South Cambridgeshire, the work to draw up these plans will be funded by the Greater Cambridge Partnership and a formal update on this funding arrangement will follow later this year. A consultation process would be part of the developing plans, allowing residents and businesses to have their say. All civil parking enforcement schemes need to generate enough income to pay for themselves, which will inform how the scheme is developed for South Cambridgeshire.

The report presented to Cambridgeshire County Council's Highways and Transport Committee contains a timetable which shows that, if all agreements are reached and the District Council's Cabinet agree, civil parking enforcement could be in place in South Cambridgeshire in 2023. Until this is the case, tackling illegal parking in South Cambridgeshire remains the responsibility of Cambridgeshire Police.

### **6 Free Trees**

You may remember that last year the District Council ran a scheme whereby they offered vouchers to parish councils for the value of 3 free trees that could be redeemed from local garden centres and planted on parish council land. This is scheme has been rebooted but with the offering doubled at 6, rather than 3 trees. Please do take advantage of this if your parish council has the land to plant them.

It is a very simple process to apply and **the deadline is Thursday 30 September 2021**.
